### 2019 DISTRICT ADVISORY COUNCIL (DAC) MEETING – SAVE THE DATE

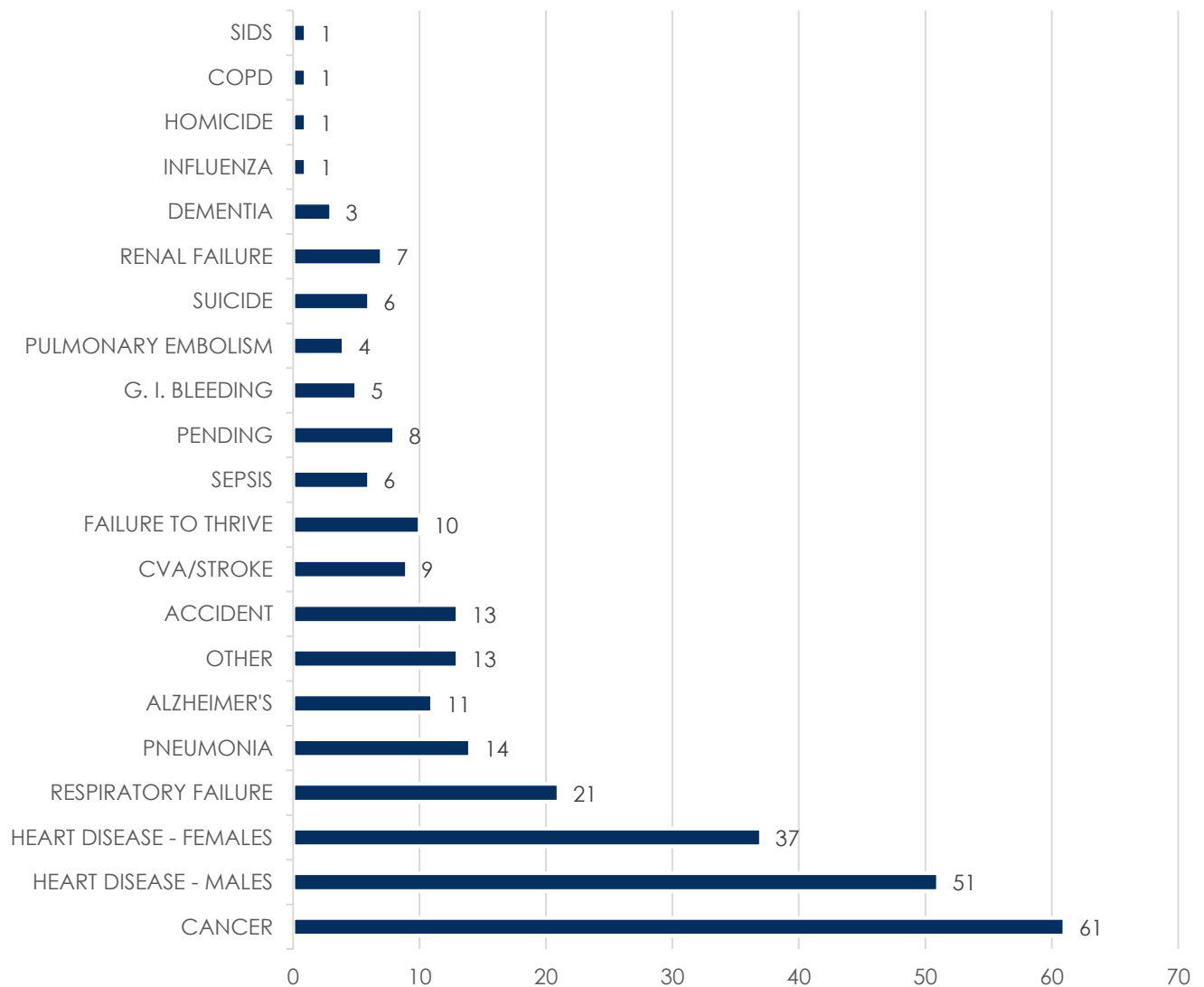

## **NURSING DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS**

### **IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM**

Immunization appointment clinics are held every 1<sup>st</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and any 5<sup>th</sup> Thursday 9-11:30am and 1-4pm; every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday 9-11:30am and 3-6:30pm at the Health Department. We also have a clinic the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month from 9-11:30am at St. John's Lutheran Church in New Washington.

- A total of 800 clients were seen and 1152 vaccines were given in the 4th quarter.
- In October we administered 100 flu vaccines to people that came to our drive-thru flu clinic at the Crawford County Fairgrounds. 2018 marked 100 years from the 1918 Flu Pandemic.



### **CMH (Children with Medical Handicaps)**

The Children with Medical Handicaps Program (CMH) is a health care program in the Ohio Department of Health (ODH). BCMH links families of children with special health care needs to a network of quality providers and helps families obtain payment for the services their children need.

- We currently have 110 children we assist with this program. 18 home visits were done this quarter.

### **Communicable Disease Investigation**

The law requires specific diseases to be reported to local health departments in an effort to control the incidence and spread of communicable disease.

- The Nursing Department has investigated 81 communicable diseases in the 4th quarter of the year. 28 Hepatitis C, 9 Hepatitis B, 29 Chlamydia, and 15 miscellaneous diseases.
- This quarter the health department nurses tested 12 clients for sexually transmitted diseases (STD's). 7 clients were treated for positive results.
- The Nurses did a presentation (and musical rap) about hepatitis at our all staff training.



### **Jail Nursing**

- Nurses worked 443.75 hours at the Crawford County Justice Center.
- Statistics: 367 inmates booked in, 249 physicals completed, 303 sick inmates seen, and 43 inmates seen for drug and alcohol withdrawals.

### **School Nursing**

- Nursing provides services for six schools in our county: Buckeye Central, Bucyrus, Colonel Crawford, Crestline, Crestline St. Joes, and Wynford.

## ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIVISION REPORT:

The 2017 grant cycle officially ended in December. We had many projects, however only 5 were completed in the 2017 cycle. The remaining projects will be forwarded into the 2018 grant for completion. We spent around half of the \$300,000 we were awarded for the 2017 grant. Our 2018 grant is for \$200,000 and we hope to spend the majority of these funds. Again, our office urges all of our townships and villages to get the word out to your residents that if they have failing household sewage systems, our office has funding to assist them in the repair and replacement of those systems. We were notified in December that we were awarded the 2019 sewage grant, which will consist of \$150,000 to spend on the repair and replacement of failing systems.

The food program has been busy with routine inspections of our licensed food operations. Food operations are required to be inspected twice during the licensing period which starts on March 1 every year. Our office opened 1 new food operation between during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2018, Lightning Nutrition, located in the city of Bucyrus. In December, the Board of Health approved the new food fees which will take effect on January 1, 2019. Our office is required to perform a cost analysis of our food program fees annually.

Our division continues to assist with the quest for achieving public health accreditation. All EH staff are members on several of the Domains that have been established for accreditation purposes and

have been assisting in the gathering of documentation for the Domains.

In December, the second reading of our new Operation and Maintenance (O&M) program rules for the sewage program were approved at the Board of Health meeting. The third and final reading of these rules will occur in January and our O & M program will officially begin operation on February 1, 2019. The O & M program is an Ohio Department of Health requirement that all local health departments must develop and administer in the hopes of getting all rural sewage systems under a maintenance program within the next 20 years. Our department will be working diligently on establishing and administering our program.

## HELP ME GROW (HMG) DIVISION



### SUPPORTING PREGNANT WOMEN, YOUNG CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN CRAWFORD COUNTY.

Fourth quarter begins our outreach and organization for Christmas sponsorship for many of our HMG families. Although some of our families have economic means to provide for Christmas, others do not. Several of the children enrolled in our services are being raised by extended family members who receive little or no financial assistance for their care. Often assistance is limited to Medicaid and WIC. We have seen many great grandparents go back to work in order to provide for the children and some have legal fees associated with obtaining custody. The help these and other HMG families receive at Christmas is very much appreciated.



We work on meeting needs first and then some wishes. Pajamas, winter clothes, coats, and blankets come before toys. Home Visitor Christy Holman organizes the project each year. She and the rest of HMG would like to thank the following for their generosity: Bucyrus Dental, General Electric, Galion LLC., Ohio Mutual and Plankton United Methodist Church.



In addition to gifts, Ohio Mutual provided much needed safety items including baby gates, cabinet locks, door knob covers and smoke detectors. Melmore Mothers Club (gift baskets) and Church in Dwight provided several boxes of laundry detergent once again.



At HMG staff meetings we have had the opportunity to meet with staff at Children Services to inform them of some of the changes in our services and share about our Cribs for Kids Program. Eliza Cole, Director of BORN, shared with us about their effort in working with the homeless in our county. (Although we don't see homeless people pushing their possessions in a grocery cart along Sandusky Ave., we do have many families "couch surfing" from one friend's home to another). We also met with Lisa Cook, Literacy Coach through Mid Ohio's ESC's Striving Reader's grant. She shared with us the importance of reading nursery rhymes explaining that children who have memorized nursery rhymes become better readers because they develop an early sensitivity to sounds of words. We will be doing our share to promote dear old Mother Goose with our families.

### This is the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter for FY19

- Our total grant this year is \$322,718.00. As of the end of the December 2018, we have spent 21% of our grant monies. Within our grant budget, \$6,768.00 will be for new computers for our new WIC system.
- In addition to the usual meetings, Kathy attended the Fall State Directors meeting and worked on Performance Evaluations for all the employees of the WIC division. Holly and Kathy attended and helped at the Help Me Grow Holiday Open house in which we serve many of the clients that HMG also serves. We also did a breastfeeding event for our breastfeeding moms in which Holly, Deanna, Monica and Kathy attended and helped. To the right is a picture of one of the projects (made from their babies' foot print). We also had our part-time clerk retire and we will be looking for a replacement in the near future.
- What is going on at WIC; we continue to educate participants on Nutrition and Breastfeeding, along with being a referral program to the many different agencies in the community. We continue to work with the Health Department to make sure our participants are up to date on all of the immunizations that they need and lead screenings. We work with Help Me Grow by referring many of our new pregnant moms to their program for the guidance they may need as a new parent, or a parent of many, or referrals to agencies that may help them in their journey as a parent.
- **Breastfeeding Initiation Rates: October – 66% November – 66% December – 65%**

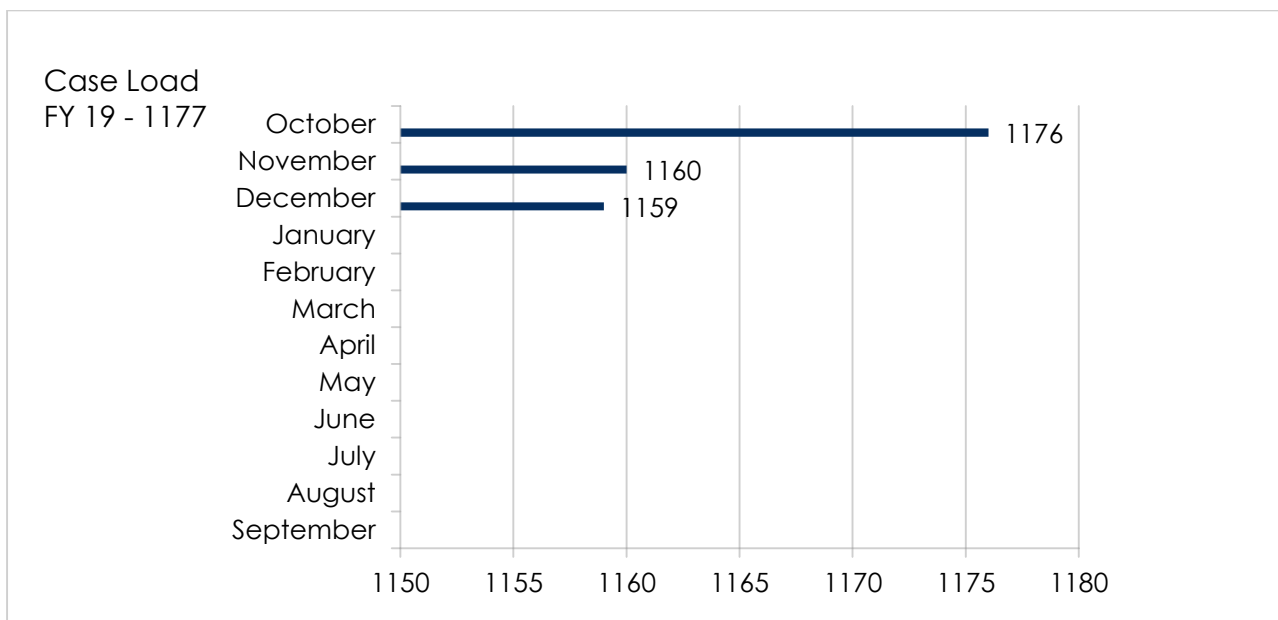
