The Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) met on May 20th and made its decision to confer accreditation to Crawford County Public Health. After years of diligent work on this effort, the Crawford County Public Health staff and Board of Health are extremely happy to announce this achievement. To receive initial accreditation through PHAB, a health department must undergo a rigorous, multi-faceted, peer-reviewed assessment process to ensure it meets or exceeds a set of public health quality standards and measures. Crawford County Public Health (CCPH) has been working on this process for the last several years, even during COVID-19 response surges.

We hope this announcement, combined with our recent efforts and response to the COVID-19 pandemic, reassures our community, our partner organizations, our funders and our elected officials that we are meeting the public health needs of those we serve as effectively as possible.




Safe@Home Program

Students participated and were given booklets with resources to support them as their confidence and support from their parents and guardians were emphasized as key components.
