- Employ & evaluate the health commissioner
- Review operational data for pattern & trends
- Approve health department programs
- Approve key financial actions for the department including the budget that is submitted to the the county budget commission.

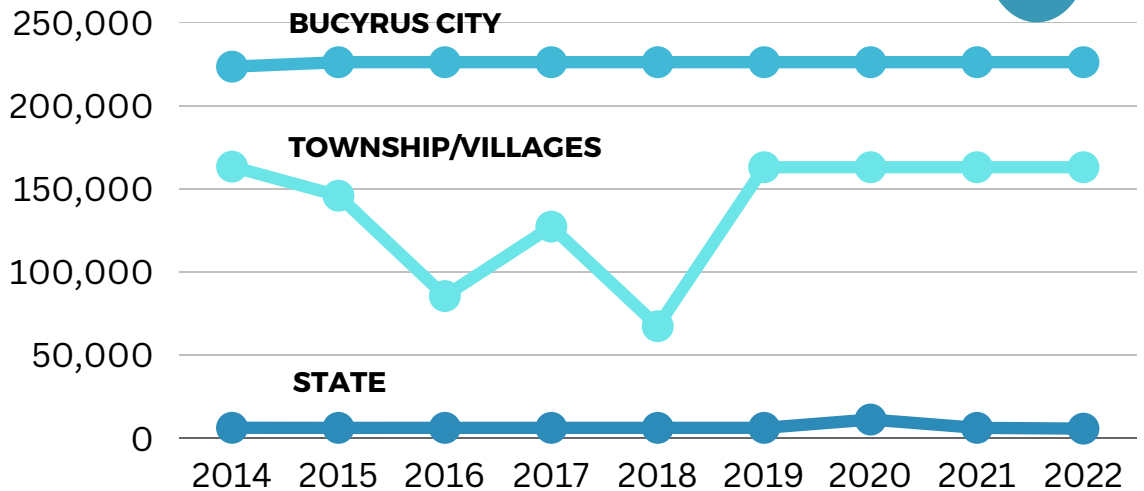

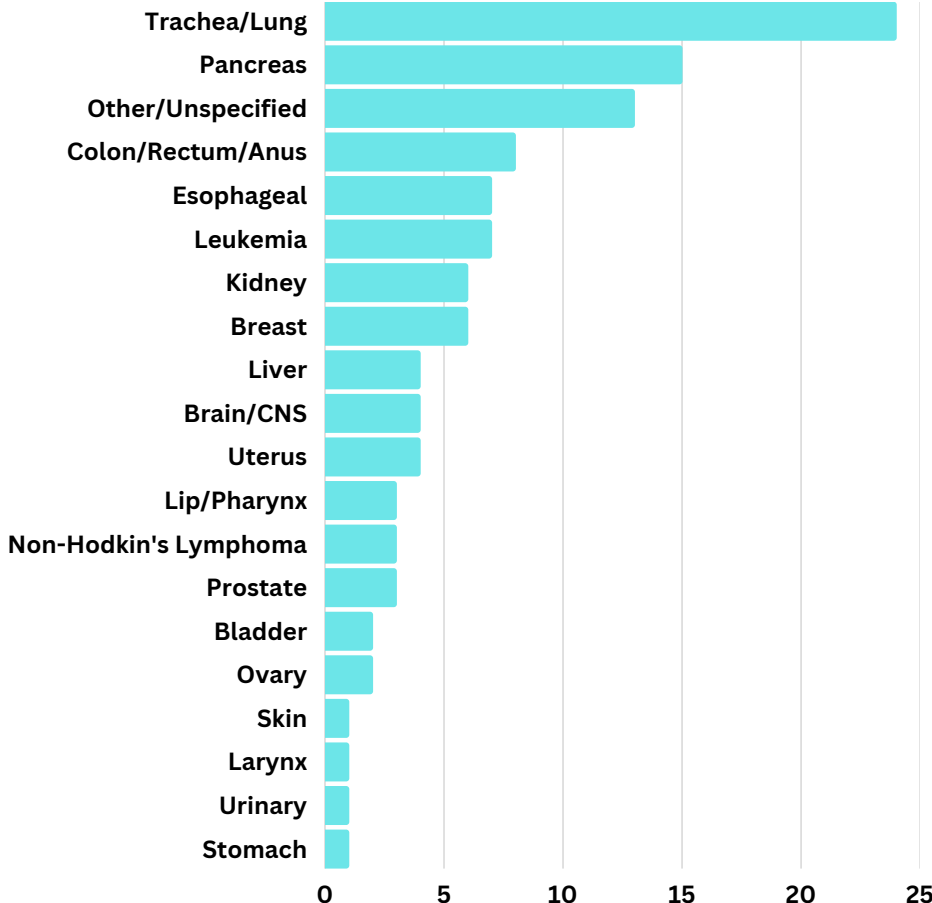

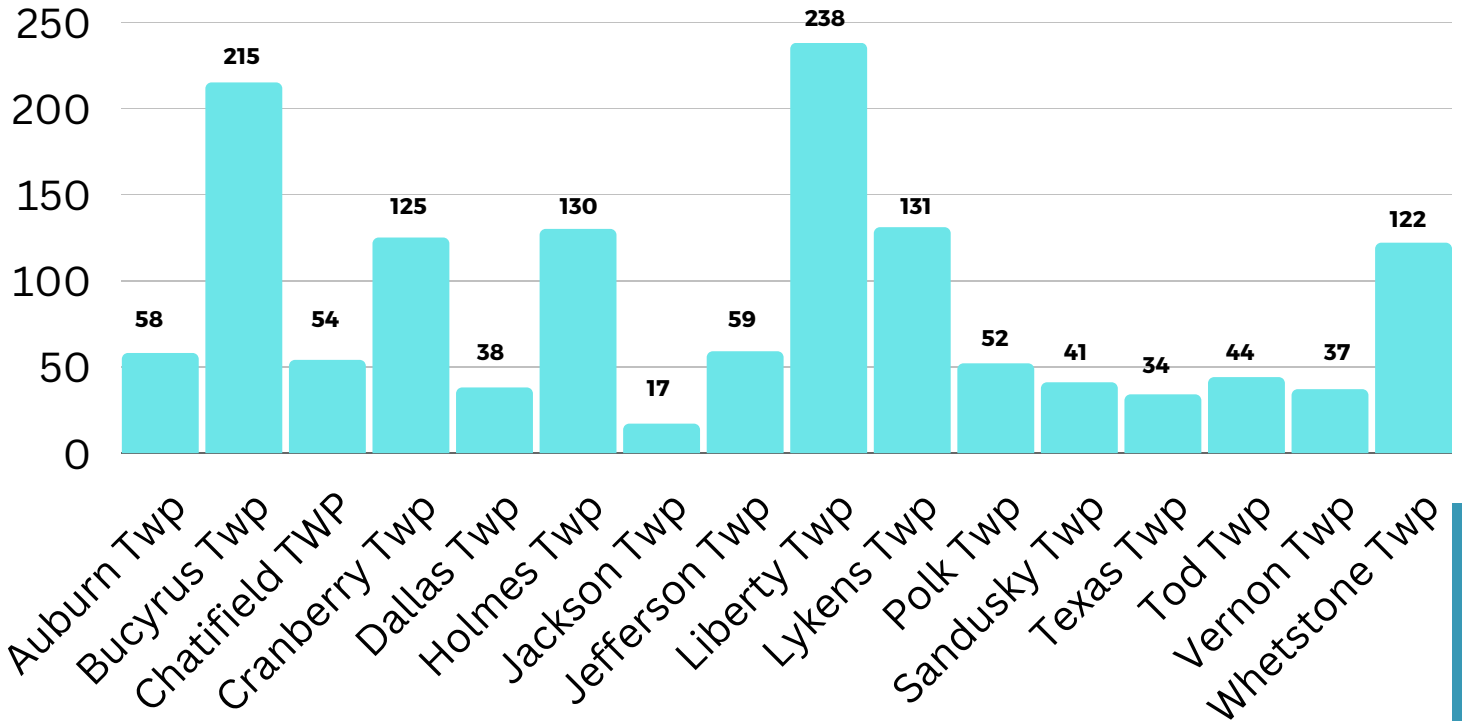

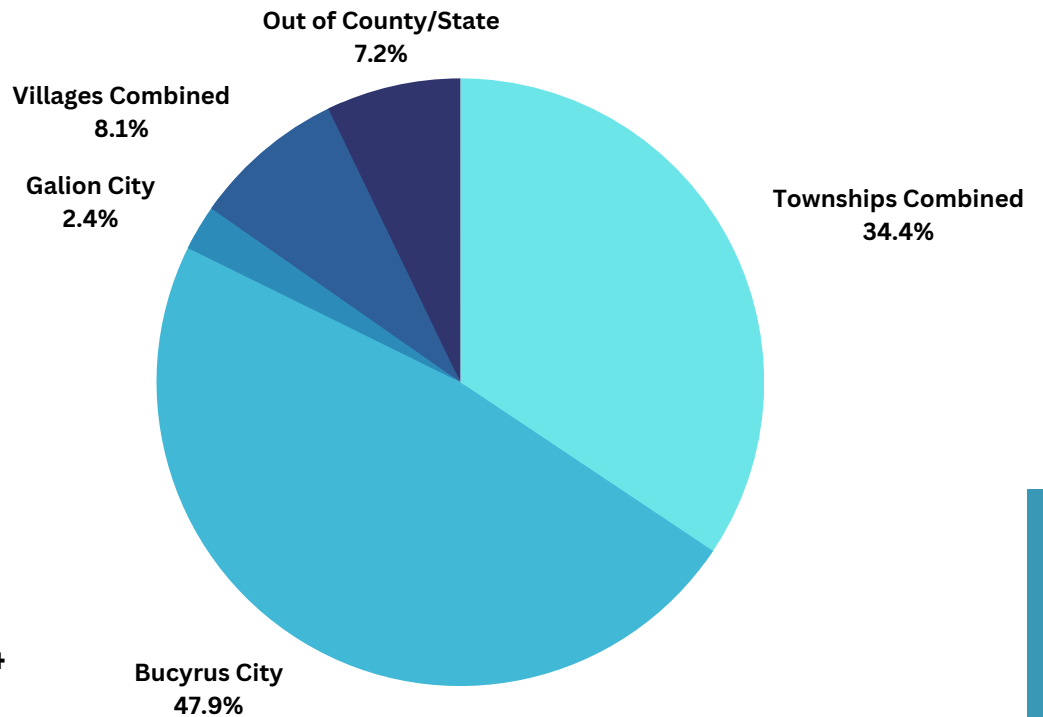

From approved donors, 7219 ounces were shipped to the OhioHealth Mothers' Milk Bank for use in NICU's across the nation.

Our WIC Division became a drop off site for the OhioHealth Mothers' Milk Bank in 2019. Approved donors bring their frozen extra breast milk to our staff and we ship it for them to the Mothers' Milk Bank. Donated breast milk is pasteurized, cultured and shipped to hospitals across the country, providing babies fighting for their lives the best chance at health.

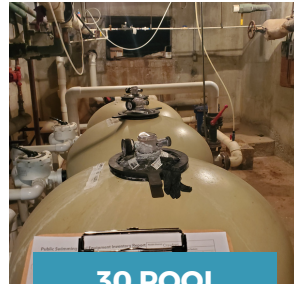

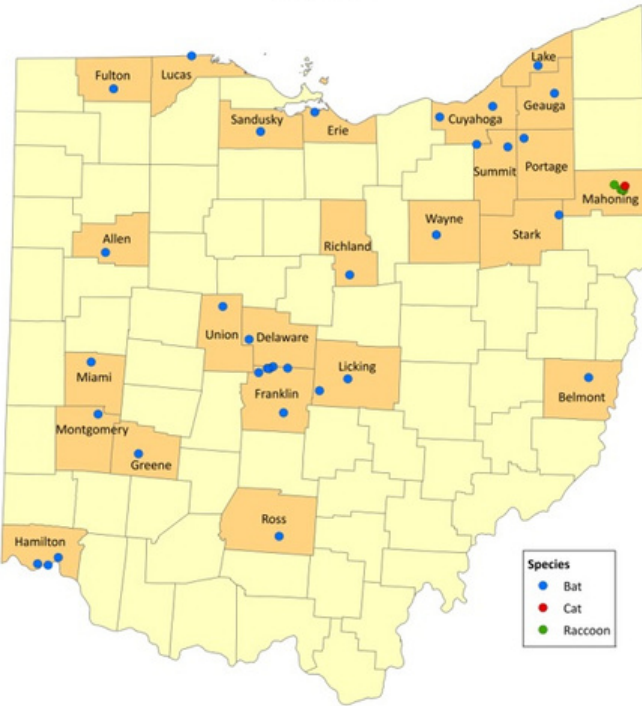

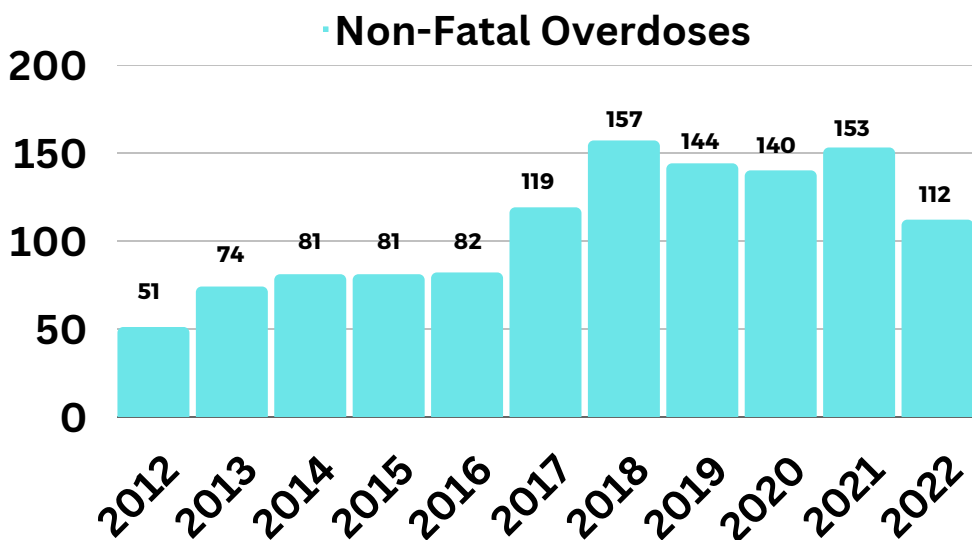

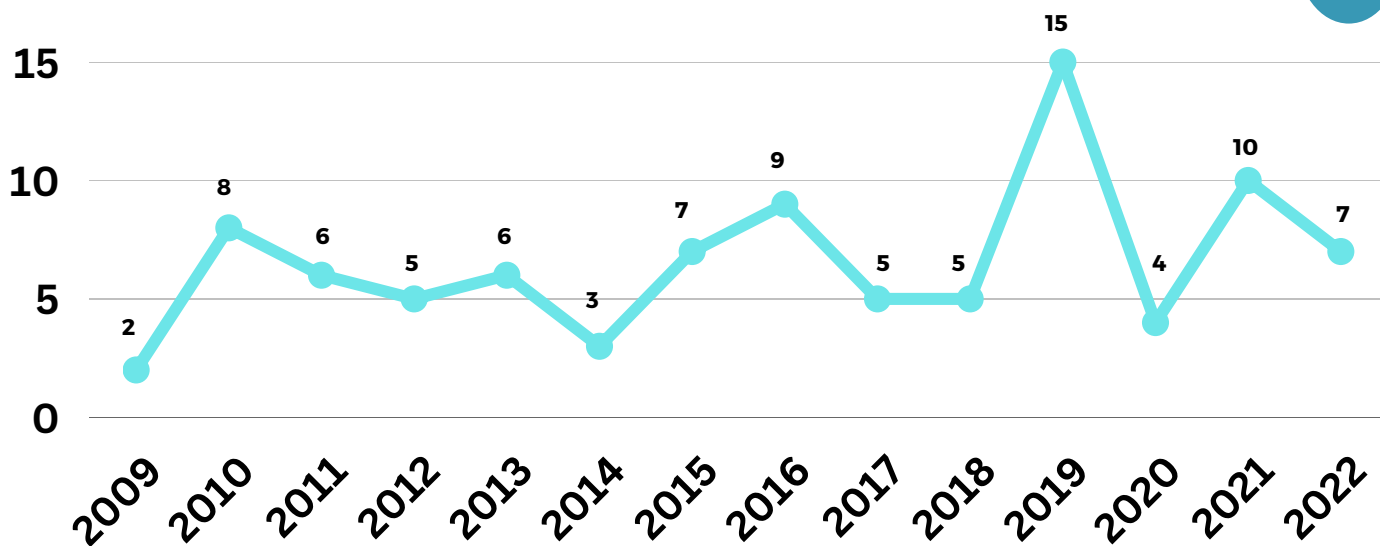

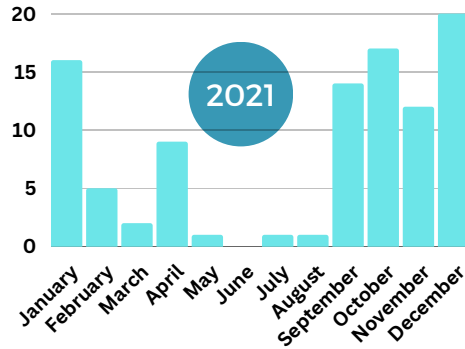

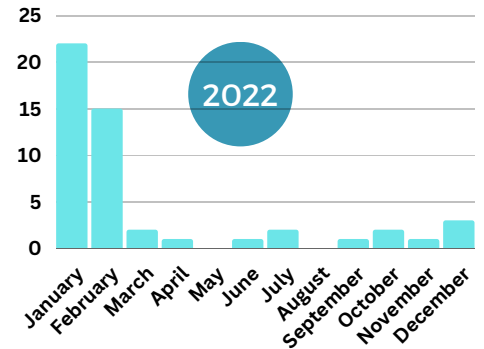

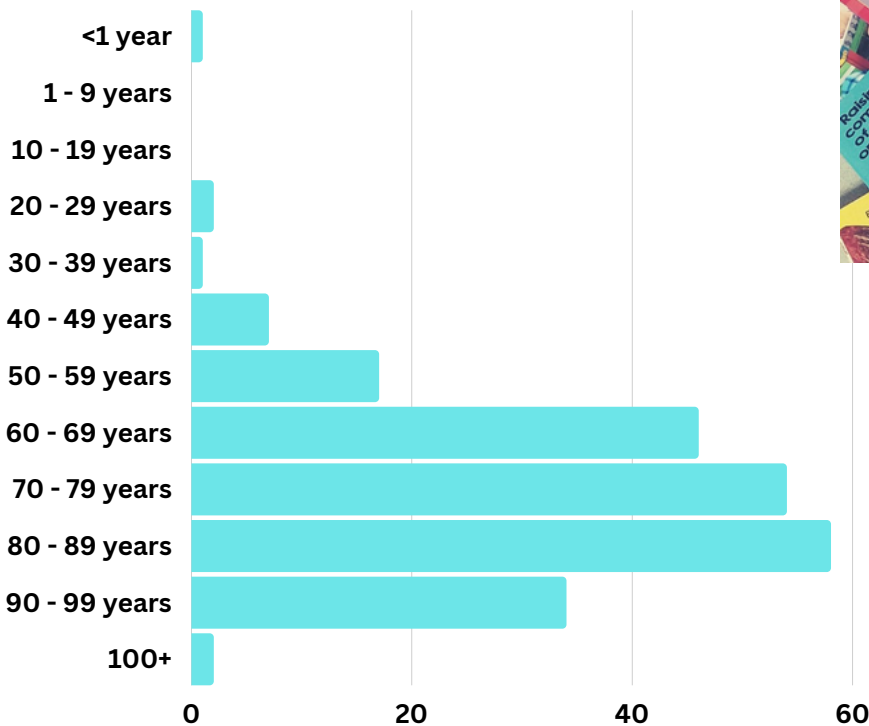

Through collaboration with the Ohio Department of Health, we were able to secure their Mobile Unit for one day in July at the county fair plus three days in the fall. The FREE health screenings available included A1C for blood sugar, blood pressure, body mass index and cholesterol.



ENCOURAGING HEALTHY EATING & ACTIVE LIVING

In 2022, CCPH was awarded a Healthy Eating & Active Living (HEAL) grant funded by the Ohio Department of Health. The focused location selected was downtown Bucyrus and a Coalition of local officials, business owners, local agencies and organizations formed. An assessment of existing conditions was completed followed by a proposal of strategies that align with the Community Health Improvement Plan.



Working together to assess community-wide strategies for healthy eating and active living to use the results to inform future work.

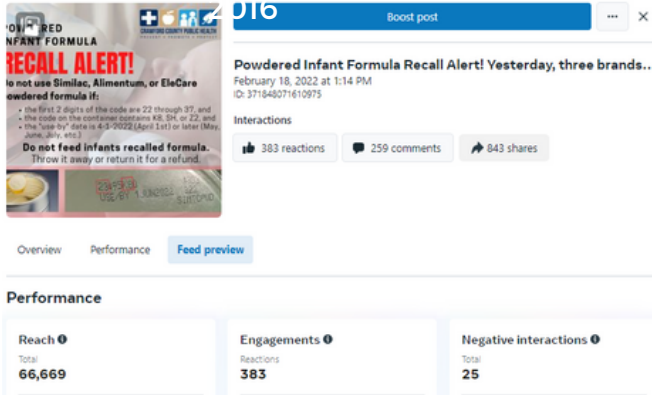

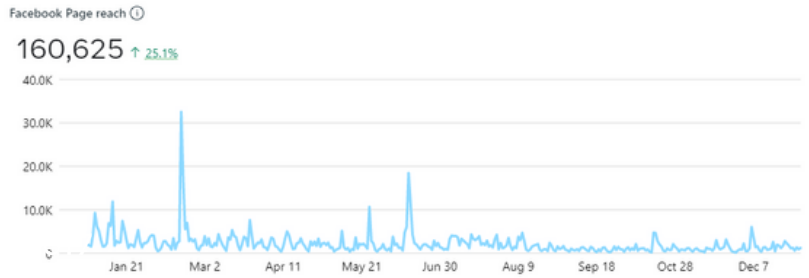

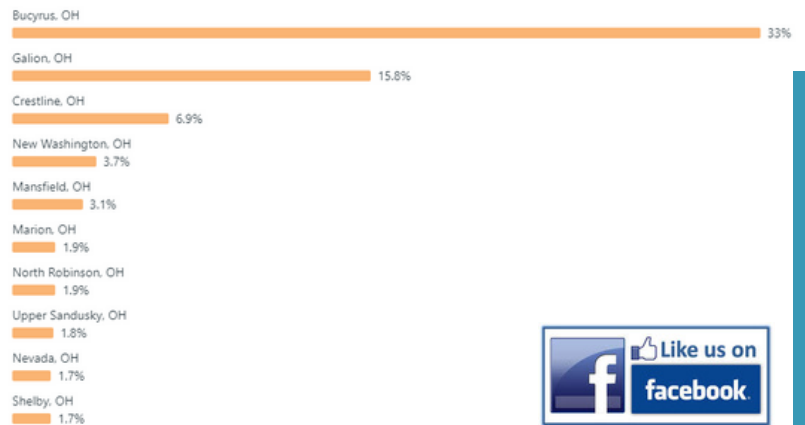

'Worried about suicide deaths:' 10 county residents committed suicide in '21, report says

The number of suicides in the county climbed in 2021, according to figures from Crawford County Public Health's annual report for 2021 — and a county health official said she's already worried about this year's numbers. According to the report, released Tuesday by Health Commissioner Kate Seifert, 10 Crawford County residents committed suicide in 2021 — eight men and two women. The youngest was 59; the oldest, 70, with an average age of 43. "Actually, I'm worried about suicide deaths for this year, more than I was last year," Seifert said. "I'm hoping I'm wrong. I'm hoping we can implement some things and get some people connected to resources they need so that we don't see a continued increase in '22, but I'm actually very worried about suicide completions this year."
