A local board of health is the policy-making, rule-making, and adjudicatory body for public health within its jurisdiction. The primary responsibilities for the board include:

- Set policy for strategic direction
- Enact resolutions to carry out day-to-day business of the organization
- Approve rules & regulations for department operations
- Employ & evaluate the health commissioner
- Review operational data for pattern & trends
- Approve health department programs
- Approve key financial actions for the department including the budget that is submitted to the the county budget commission.










This program is a financial assistance program for families with special health care needs. Our nurses help families with the application and provide case management for those approved.

Every three years the Crawford County Health Partners convene to collaboratively conduct a community health assessment and then a community health improvement plan, based on the findings of the assessment.





WIC



WIC is a nutrition program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) that provides public supports under the USDA by providing nutrition education, access to nutritious foods, breastfeeding support, and healthcare referrals for income-eligible women who are pregnant or postpartum, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk.

From approved donors, 7219 ounces were shipped to the OhioHealth Mothers' Milk Bank for use in NICU's across the nation.

Our WIC Division became a drop off site for the OhioHealth Mothers' Milk Bank in 2019. Approved donors bring their frozen extra breast milk to our staff and we ship it for them to the Mothers' Milk Bank. Donated breast milk is pasteurized, cultured and shipped to hospitals across the country, providing babies fighting for their lives the best chance at health.

CASELOADS

The caseload for the Early Intervention team is 80 with a few families pending eligibility. The Home Visiting Team is also carrying a caseload of 80 families with a waitlist.






EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS



DRUG OVERDOSE TRENDS




In 2022, there were 112 non-fatal overdoses by Crawford County residents reporting to an ER or Urgent Care Center in Ohio. 67 males & 45 females with an average age of 35 years. The year with the most cases of overdose was 2018 with 157. The year with the most deaths was 2017 (18).








COVID-19 DEATHS



FREE HEALTH SCREENINGS




Through collaboration with the Ohio Department of Health, we were able to secure their Mobile Unit for one day in July at the county fair plus three days in the fall. The FREE health screenings available included A1C for blood sugar, blood pressure, body mass index and cholesterol.



ENCOURAGING HEALTHY EATING & ACTIVE LIVING

In 2022, CCPH was awarded a Healthy Eating & Active Living (HEAL) grant funded by the Ohio Department of Health. The focused location selected was downtown Bucyrus and a Coalition of local officials, business owners, local agenies and organizations formed. An assessment of existing conditions was completed followed by a proposal of strategies that align with the Community Health Improvement Plan.






