- Review operational data for pattern & trends
- Approve health department programs
- Approve key financial actions for the department including the budget that is submitted to the the county budget commission



PHAB ANNUAL REPORT - 2023

Crawford County Public Health became nationally accredited in 2022. The submission of a PHAB Annual Report is required of all accredited health departments. The purpose is to ensure conformity with the PHAB Standards to support advancing quality, performance, and transformation.

Ohio is currently the only state that requires all local health departments to achieve PHAB Accreditation. Out of the 111 local health departments, 90 have completed PHAB Accreditation.








2023 Expenses







Types of Cancer Listed as Cause of Death




2023 DEATHS BY AGE GROUP & MONTH







COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Every three years the Crawford County Health Partners convene to collaboratively conduct a community health assessment (CHA) and then a community health improvement plan (CHIP), based on the findings of the assessment. The current CHIP is for years 2023-2025 and strategies for the top three priorities are listed.







WIC is a nutrition program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) that provides public supports under the USDA by providing nutrition education, access to nutritious foods, breastfeeding support, and healthcare referrals for income-eligible women who are pregnant or postpartum, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk.

Our WIC Division became a drop off site for the OhioHealth Mothers' Milk Bank in 2019. Approved donors bring their frozen extra breast milk to our staff and we ship it for them to the Mothers' Milk Bank. Donated breast milk is pasteurized, cultured and shipped to hospitals across the country, providing babies fighting for their lives the best chance at health.







Since 2021, the WIC Division has utilized a grant to help local employers provide lactation supports for their employees returning to the workforce after having a baby. Our role is to provide education and assistance to businesses and agencies in Crawford County free of charge.






2023 LYME DISEASE

In 2023, the Ohio Department of Health reported the first case of Lyme Disease for a resident of Crawford County. The year 2023 concluded with **ODH** reporting 1,297 cases of Lyme Disease across Ohio, compared to a total of 447 cases in 2022.


2023 - 1,297 cases

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Each and every day, the risk of emergency exists and public health is always preparing to respond in the face of a crisis. We regularly participate in exercises with community partners and are constantly updating and revising our emergency response plans. Through grant funding, we are able to provide Stop the Bleed (tourniquet) trainings and we are always looking for Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) volunteers.

In 2023 we participated in both a table-top exercise (a mock radiological incident) and a full-scale exercise (a medical countermeasure distribution scenario).

The Crawford County Healthcare Coalition met twice in 2023 and consists of representatives from the hospital, long-term care facilities, hospice, dialysis, Board of Developmental Disabilities, Emergency Management Agency, mental health and transportation providers. This group participates in drills and exercises to ensure their facilities are prepared for an emergency response.

The Crawford County Medical Reserve Corps (CCMRC) volunteers has increased in both activity and in size of number of volunteers. There are currently 39 members and they have been active in participating at community outreach events and have also provided services such as providing free blood pressure checks, packaging items for the Harm Reduction Vending Machines, and promoting emergency preparedness.

ENCOURAGING HEALTHY EATING & ACTIVE LIVING

In 2022 & 2023, CCPH was awarded a Healthy Eating & Active Living (HEAL) grant funded by the Ohio Department of Health. The focused location selected was downtown Bucyrus and a coalition of local officials, business owners, local agencies and organizations formed. An assessment of existing conditions was completed and followed by a proposal of strategies that align with the Community Health Improvement Plan. This group meets every 3rd Tuesday of the month at 2:00pm at the Bucyrus Public Library.

Two of the Prevention Coalition events in 2023 included the inaugural *Amplified Expressions of our Journey* hosted by the Galion Community Theatre and the installation of two Harm Reduction Vending Machines located outside of each Avita Health System ER entrance. The Amplified Expressions event partnered local artists with local people in recovery to share creative artworks representing their journey from addiction to recovery.




DRUG OVERDOSE TRENDS



In 2022, there were 112 non-fatal overdoses by Crawford County residents reporting to an ER or Urgent Care Center in Ohio. 67 males & 45 females with an average age of 35 years. The year with the most cases of overdose was 2018 with 157. The year with the most deaths was 2017 (18).

The air quality index for Crawford County indicates sections of our county are either "Unhealthy" or "Very Unhealthy". Today's air quality and weather has nothing to do with clouds, it is all smoke from the wildfires in Canada. (The Meteorologists from the morning news indicated there isn't a cloud in the sky on the radar across Ohio -- it would be a blue-sky, sunny day without all this smoke.) Poor air quality can cause health problems, espeicially for those with chronic heart or lung disease, children, the elderly, and pregnant women. The particulates in the smoke can be inhaled and cause irritation of the eyes, nose or throat, coughing, shortness of breath, and chest pain. Precautions include limiting time outdoors, using high efficiency filters with your air conditioning system, and avoid smoking tobacco products. To hopefully ease some worries, please know that Crawford County is a county consisting of nothing but headwaters. What does that mean? We are the starting points for the different watersheds in our county and all of our water/runoff drains away from Crawford County. This graphic is the map from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources showing the streams and drainage areas across the state. A cool feature - the dark red line that goes across the state is "The Divide" -- meaning watersheds above that line flow north towards Lake Erie and the watersheds below the red line head south towards the Ohio River.
